Guest speaker: Jim Jones, the Cane Rod history project Fireside Chat, with David Hemmings on Zoom. Jim, David and Fred von Riebnitz are developing a history of Australian cane rods which can be found at https://sites.google.com/view/australian-bamboo-fly-rods/a-brief-history. It explores the origins and influences on Australian makers in considerable depth. It has grown from increasing interest in the craft over the past decade-plus and particularly examines the relative influence of

English and US makers. An extremely polished piece of work beautifully presented, which will continue to evolve and for which they are all to be highly commended.
