### Financial:

## **AAT Report:**

Largely not properly covered due to recording issues. Main points captured were more discussion re the Shallow Waters project and further proposal for voluntary buoyed corridor on Penstock.

### **Activities:**

### **General Business:**

Insurance – the indemnity issues: there was considerable discussion of the indemnity circulated, as was intended. The Committee realise it is a challenging document – in Rob's words, 'fearsome' – but the Committee has the responsibility to insure our members and assets as best we can. This matter has now been dragging on for two years plus. AAT have now taken on board some of the matters raised over this period and have decided to seek their own legal advice, for the benefit of all clubs which may choose to be involved. In the absence of something like the indemnity circulated, the Committee have serious concerns that our existing policy provides us very limited cover, if any, for some \$550pa. It is a conversation that needs to be had, and it is pleasing AAT are taking up the relevant issues.

#### **Round Robin:**

At this point meeting fatigue had set in and there were few volunteers. Malcolm Crosse drew our attention to widespread concerns from clubs around the state re the depredations of cormorants, particularly on rivers and streams. It's a perennial problem but difficult to gauge a solution....

#### **Presentations**

Presentations were made for the Fowler Trophy – renowned cormorants Lipscombe and Exel – and the Salmon Ponds casting. Paul McCosh won the overall Hedley Griggs Plate and the

Margaret Knight dry fly, Wayne Bellette the Hedley Griggs wet fly. Norm Cribbin was earlier awarded the Johnny Walker Clubman of the Year at the AGM.
