#### **AAT Meeting report**

Irrigation – Terry Byard (Minister's working party)

Arthurs Lake – level Dec 08 947.26m ASL, noe just under 950m

Project increased to 38,500Ml p.a to put water into the lower Jordan.

AAT proposed a 3 tier level management regime:

- environmental level above which there is no restriction on extraction
- below this restrict take to inflow from previous winter
- establish a no-take level

Hydro are proposing a regime where the lake is managed at or above 950m by Nov 1 each year and at or above 949m by June 1 each year **provided Great Lake remains** above 18.2% of capacity.

There will be progressive irrigation restrictions between 949m and 947.5m. No take if level goes below this.

<u>Stone Hut proposal</u> – Hydro are awaiting funding to build a 30,000Ml dam at Stone Hut Hill on the Ouse to capture overflow from Augusta. Will be stocked. About 8000Ml will be diverted to Lake Echo via Monpeelyata canal. Will allow better regulation of flow in the Ouse.

#### Sorell/Crescent

Sorell now about 0.4m below full, Crescent 0.8m. Turbidity in Sorell noticeably reduced.

Proposed to build two storages to take water from the Shannon to the Clyde. This should provide about half the water historically taken from Sorell/Crescent.

#### **Woods Lake**

Some water from N Midlands scheme will go to irrigators on the N end of the Lake River (about 50% of what presently goes out of Woods). Proposed to cap the take from Woods.

There will be a reduction in flow through Brumbys of about 30,000Ml p.a. Impact of this is not known, Hydro looking at it.
