## Penstock Lagoon – IFS proposal for electric or manual power only.

Letters from N Grose and M Stevens (AAT) were read out. M Crosse said that use of the lagoon had changed in recent years with up to 28 boats, some very large, being seen at one time. The fish have become boat-shy and no longer feed consistently on duns. The number of anglers needs to be limited to ensure the survival of the fishery. Arguments about safety can be addressed to some extent by construction of a second boat ramp.
